- High-Intensity Rehabilitation (licensed physical, occupational and speech therapists; recreational therapy, neuro psychological services, social work services and community integration)

BENEFITS TO ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY AND VA PATIENTS

CareMeridian offers active duty servicemen and VA patients specialized care from skilled medical and rehabilitation professionals in a non-institutional setting.

At *CareMeridian*, we:

- Are able to receive patients from the Veterans Home that have become too medically complex
- Can be utilized as a holding facility for patients waiting for an open bed at the Veterans Home, allowing them to continue to have their medical and rehabilitation needs met by experienced, caring staff
- Are part of the recovery continuum for returning wounded warriors
- Accept patients for short- or long-term stays and patients with complex long-term medical issues for permanent living options
- Assist injured soldiers in the community re-entry process through home and workplace evaluations combined with community integration to provide maximum independence and safety upon discharge

OUR PATIENTS

Sam Nichols suffered a traumatic brain injury as a result of a roadside bomb in Iraq. He wasn't expected to live and was ultimately transferred to *CareMeridian's* Granite Bay facility.

Adam Combs suffered a near-fatal motorcycle accident in 2008. He spent a month in a Bay-area hospital before being moved to a nearby convalescent facility where he grew weaker and sicker. He was then transferred to *CareMeridian's* Fresno Marks facility.

If *CareMeridian* is not yet contracted under your VISN, letters of agreement (LOAs) can be negotiated on a specific patient's behalf.
